Facility Type	Description
Residential Childcare (including Child Placing Agencies and Residential Treatment Centers)	Facilities that provide childcare services to 13 or more children for 24 hours a day in a location other than the child's own home. Facilities often provide medical and mental health services. Inspected annually for compliance.
Licensed Child Care Centers or Day Cares	Centers that serve seven or more children from ages 0 to 13 who attend the child-care center for only part of the 24-hour day. Inspected annually for compliance.
Licensed Childcare Homes (also known as Group Day Care Homes or At-home Day Cares)	Individuals provide childcare in the caregiver's residence for children from birth through 13 years. Including the children related to the caregiver running the day care, the total number of children must not exceed 12 at any time. Inspected annually for compliance.
Registered Child Care Homes	Similar to Licensed Childcare Homes but inspected less frequently (every 1-2 years), held to slightly less stringent standards, and only six children under the age of 14 are allowed to be present in the home at any given time.
Listed Family Homes	Includes individuals who receive compensation for providing in-home childcare for 1-3 unrelated children. These homes are not inspected unless there is a reported allegation of abuse, neglect, or misconduct.
