Students always look surprised when, lecturing on drug policy, I state that the international aspects of drug control policy are more significant than the domestic ones. People know about the history of the mid-nineteenth-century Chinese opium wars and Britain's apparent "foisting" of opium on the Chinese. But the rest is a blank. The existence since the First World War of a system of international regulation of the trade and use of narcotic drugs; and the political dimensions of that control system, do not enter public perceptions of the drugs issue. Recent *Guardian* articles on crop

substitution in Bolivia and the international drug trade made almost no mention of it.

This is not for lack of published work on the subject. As far back as Owen's *British opium policy in China and India* published in 1934, scholars have been looking at aspects of the Far Eastern opium trade.¹ The 1960s saw work on the system of international control, with books by Lowes on the origins of international narcotics control and Taylor on American diplomacy and the narcotics traffic.² Bruun, Pan and Rexed's work on *The gentlemen's club* in the mid-1970s, although not strictly history, opened
